"This has been a journey. I brought my dad who has Alzheimer's disease to Maui so I could take care of him. Although our sweet 'Nagypapa' was afflicted with several health conditions, it was his Alzheimer's that brought him into our care in 2018. I signed up for classes with the **ALZHEIMER'S ASSOCIATION** and learned about the disease and what comes with it. I took over 5 classes and I couldn't have done it without these classes and the support systems it provided. I shared what I learned with other people in my family and with my dad's friends. I was able to get connected to resources and enrolled my dad in adult daycare so I could continue to work full time. **ALZHEIMER'S ASSOCIATION** was always there for us as we walked this journey & learned how best to care for him.
